## Public Invited to MoPac Meet the Contractor Event

**(Austin, Texas)** – Construction signs are going up next week on MoPac (Loop 1) between Lady Bird Lake and Parmer Lane in preparation for construction to begin on the MoPac Improvement Project. To give drivers and nearby residents a better idea of what to expect during construction, the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority and the project’s design-build contractor, CH2M HILL, are hosting a “Meet the Contractor” Open House. The event will feature graphics describing the construction process. There will also be videos showing how MoPac will look like in late 2015 when the project is complete. Project team members will be on hand to answer specific questions about sound wall construction, bicycle and pedestrian improvements, aesthetic enhancements, and construction related traffic management plans.
